Rainbow Camp is back this summer! ORUUC will host "Making the Rainbow Connection," in partnership with the Blossom Center for Childhood Excellence, Tuesday, June 28 through Friday, July 1, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. daily. Know Your COVID-19 Community Level

Covid-19 Community Levels are a new tool from the CDC to help communities decide what prevention steps to take based on the latest data. Levels can be low, medium, or high, and are determined by looking at hospital beds being used, hospital admissions, and the total number of new COVID-19 cases in an area. Get Free At-Home COVID-19 Tests

Every home in the U.S. is eligible to

receive four free at-home COVID-19 tests. Orders

usually ship in 7-12 days. Order tests now so you have them when you need them: https://www.covidtests.gov/

Note: At-home COVID-19 rapid test kits contain a small amount of sodium azide. To prevent accidental poisonings, poison control centers recommend the following tips:

- Store the kit "up and away," out of the sight and reach of children and pets.
- Leave the kit sealed until needed and throw it away immediately after use.
- Make sure to read and follow the instructions on the package before using.


